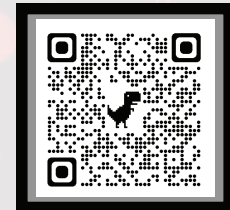

Parent/Business Leader Opportunity: Advisory boards have been an important part of the Career Center basis of operations even prior to the first class meeting in the fall of 1972. Program advisory board committees have been formed for each career-tech area and have continued to offer advice on curriculum, equipment, and other matters relating to each subject area during the history of the Career Center.

Advisory board committee members are selected from employers, government agencies, schools, unions, or any organization which has a relationship to the body of skills and knowledge being taught in the various career areas. These committees meet at least once per year to offer support, guidance, and direction to each program area.

Other student opportunities include national career - technical student organizations, which encourage interested students to focus on community service, charity work, competition on personal growth, leadership skills, and community involvement.

J. Everett Light Career Center qualified students will participate in the National Technical Honor Society. This is an international organization which recognizes academic excellence, as well as student occupational proficiencies.

Dual Credit for J. Everett Light Courses: Enrollment in some of our courses may enable the student to receive college credit as well as high school credit. Students can save time and money because they may not have to take these classes at college. See the instructor for more information.

Governor's Work Ethic Certificate is a critical secondary education program for high school graduates who are committed to delivering employer-recognized employability skills as they prepare to join today's workforce.
